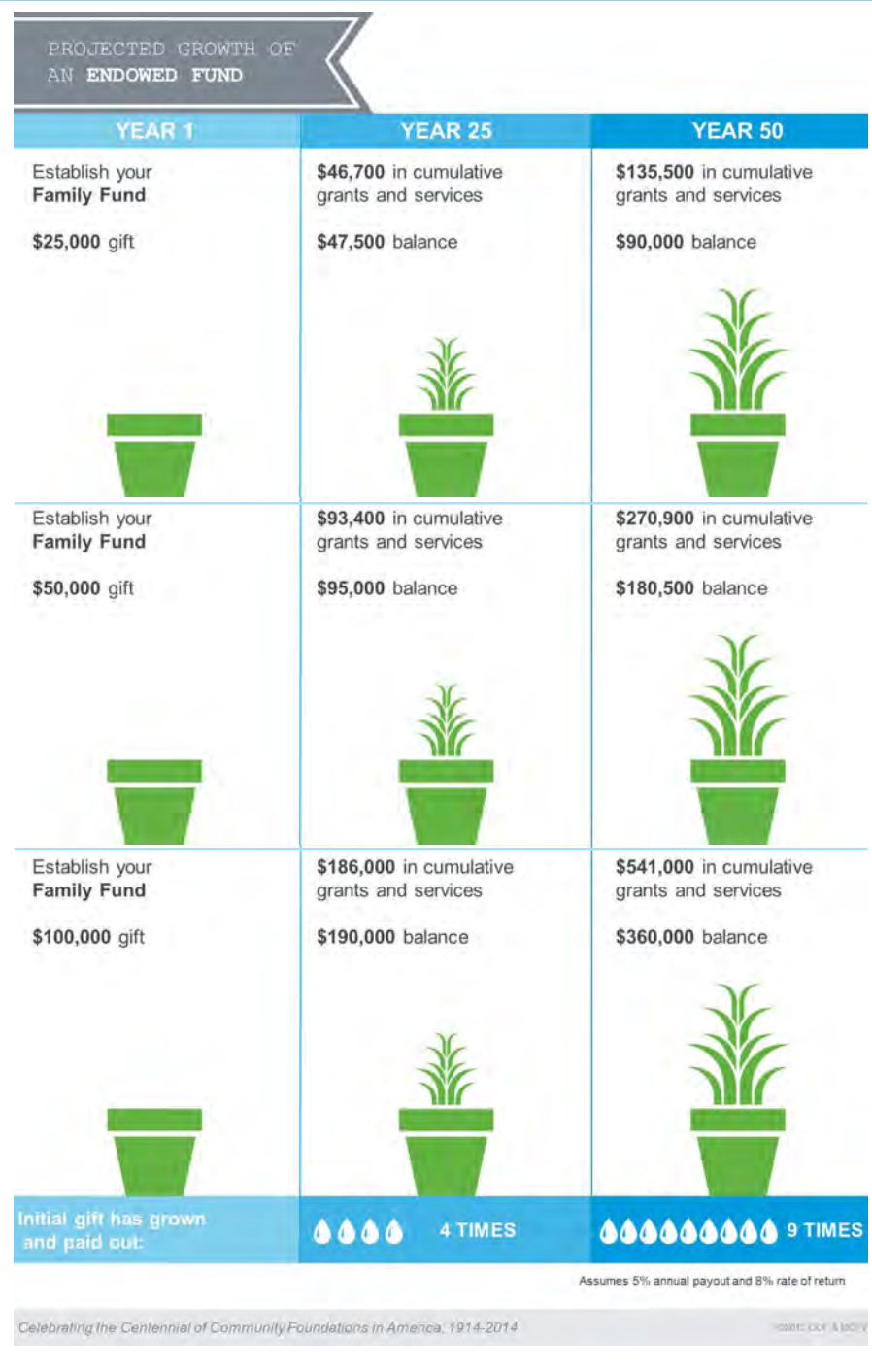
Well, with this simple infographic we hope to illustrate just a couple of different gift amounts and what they will have accomplished in a quarter century and a half century.

Why 25 and 50 years?

Well, in 25 years, between the current value of the endowment fund and the cumulation total of grants and services provided from the fund, your initial gift will have grown nearly four times! And in 50 years that amount is nearly nine times as large!

So, take a moment and study the image to the right and discover how \$25,000, \$50,000, and \$100,000 today can become \$225,000, \$400,000, and \$900,000 tomorrow.

Scholarships will be awarded in May 2014 from over 100 donor funded scholarships to graduating seniors and current college students from Bay and Arenac Counties.

This event gives children from low income families the opportunity to partner with local police officers to bring the holiday spirit into their homes.



Each child was given a \$100 gift card and sent to browse the store with their police officer partner so they could purchase gifts for themselves, siblings, and parents. Afterwards, YAC volunteers worked with the children to wrap and label their gifts and get them ready to put under the tree. Participants at the event were also treated to free music, a pizza dinner, autographs and pictures from Saginaw Spirit Hockey players, a visit from the Sammy Spirit (the Saginaw Spirit mascot), and balloon hats and animals.

Five year YAC member, and current committee Vice-Chair, Gabrielle San Juan explained "This is our third year participating in this event. It's always fun and provides an opportunity for kids to really connect and have a positive experience with local police officers."
