## **Hemlock Semiconductor Community and Regional Empowerment (CARE) Grant Program**

This grant opportunity aligns with the HSC Mission to improve vitality and quality of life in communities where Hemlock Semiconductor's employees work and reside.

- Grants to organizations with a 501(c)(3) designation, schools or units of government
- Grant amounts are up to \$10,000 for local (one of Midland/Bay/Saginaw) or \$30,000 for regional projects/programs
- Grants are for one year only
- Organizations may only submit requests for the **same project** two years in a row
- Grants are to be used to support projects/programs - **NOT operational costs**
- Organizations should apply through the community foundation where their organization is headquartered
